Ch. 1 Introductory provisions

National objectives

- Life, health, property and the environment with consideration given to local conditions – the provision of equivalent, satisfactory and comprehensive civil protection
- Rescue services within an acceptable time, and using effective methods



Ch. 1 Introductory provisions

Definitions

<u>Rescue services = national or municipal</u>

- Emergencies or imminent danger of emergencies
- Prevent and limit injury to individuals, and damage to property and the environment
- Need for a rapid response
- The importance of that which is threatened
- The cost of the operation
- Other circumstances

Ch. 2 The obligations of the individual Obligations for owners or beneficiaries

- Fire prevention measures
- Life-saving equipment
- Fire prevention documentation (owner)

Obligations for dangerous activities

- Preparedness & equipment(owner or person carrying on activities)
- Risk analysis(person carrying on activities)
- Notification obligation (person carrying on activities)

Ch. 3 The obligations of the municipality

Preventive measures

- Ensure that measures are taken to prevent fires, and the injuries and damage that they cause
- Work towards attaining protection against other emergencies (without restricting the responsibility of others)
- Cooperation
- Expert advice and information to the individual
- Plan of action
- Chimney sweeping and fire prevention inspections

Rescue services

- Responsibility
- Cooperation
- Plan of action

Subsequent measures

- Written record of the decision to "end an operation"
- Information about guarding etc.
- Investigation

Organisation

- One or more committees
- Organisation for several municipalities
- Qualifications of personnel
- Conditions of employment

Command

- Chief Fire Officer
- Incident Commander

Ch. 4 The obligations of the state

Rescue services

- Mountain rescue
- Air search & rescue (SAR)
- Maritime SAR
- Searching for missing persons
- Maritime environmental protection
- Emergency service for dealing with emissions of radioactive substances from nuclear energy establishments

Command

- Incident Commanders appointed by the relevant authority
- The relevant county administrative board may assume responsibility



Ch. 5 Supervision

- Municipality
- County administrative board
- Swedish Civil Contingencies Agency or other competent authority appointed by the government
- A fee for certain supervisory visits



- Ch. 6 Special obligations for individuals, municipalities, and government authorities
 - Duty to serve if called upon
 - Encroachment of others' rights
 - Documentation of decisions
 - Obligation to assist the rescue services and/or with decontamination after an emission of radioactive substances
 - Duty to report submit particulars
 - Alerting
